1.6 Motion to temporarily assign Bonnie Ioele as Board Secretary.

Motion was made to move item 1.6 by Mrs. Panzarelli, and seconded by Ms. Malinconico. Motion carried by unanimous roll call vote of 8-0.

2.0 Presentation – Monmouth County Arts by Emma Grabowski

Emma Grabowski thanked the district for allowing her to attend Monmouth County Arts program every Monday from end of January to beginning of May from noon to 4:30 p.m. at Neptune High School. She was responsible for regular classwork that she missed. Her weekly assignment was to take pictures related to specific categories. She learned different styles of photography and met other students with the same interest. The students critiqued each other’s work. At the end of the program, there was an art show and she had to choose four photographs to put on display. One of the four photographs was chosen to be part of a traveling photography show. It was a great learning experience. She is grateful for the opportunity to see if this is something she wants to pursue in her future.

3.0 President’s Remarks

- Mr. Bright distributed a hard copy of the superintendent evaluation and asked the Board to return the hard copy or return electronically before the next board meeting on June 13, 2018.
- Mr. Bright encouraged board members that are available, to attend end-of-year events at the Central School and High School.
- Mr. Bright congratulated both the Girls Softball and CS Boys Baseball on a great season.

Ms. Kutschman spoke of the Global Logistics and Supply Chain Management Awards Dinner that she attended last night with Dr. Savoia. Mr. Bender, the Supply Chain Management Teacher in KHS, held an awards ceremony attended by the Monmouth County Superintendent and Mr. Green Tea, professor from Rutgers, and someone from the Dept. of Ed. The boys did a presentation and everyone was

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blown away by their public speaking. Keyport is one of nine districts that offer this course. Next year there will be 17 districts that have applied. One of the boys that was in the program has decided to major in Supply Chain because of this course. Anything the district can do to help direct graduates into a field is beneficial. The professor from Rutgers said these boys attended one of his classes and commented that the High School students were more involved and asked more questions than the college students.

4.0 Communications – Dr. Savoia

- 4.1 Jessica Dougherty, Language Arts Teacher, submitted her letter of resignation on May 24, 2018, effective June 30, 2018. Resolution 11.10 under Personnel.
- 4.2 Matthew Masiello, Speech Pathologist, submitted his letter of resignation on May 25, 2018, effective May 25, 2018. Resolution 11.13 under Personnel.

5.0 Public Participation – Agenda Items

- Patrick Moroney, 313 Main Street, stated there are several parents and community members present who feel strongly about making arts and music education a budget funding priority for the 19/20 school year and beyond. He is appreciative of some recent encouraging development in this area and hopes to keep the momentum going. There are fewer opportunities to perform in Keyport than in other districts. Artsednow.org is a nonprofit organization that helps small districts who don't have Art Supervisor positions advise in areas like scheduling and sequencing and with ideas for integrating arts into other subjects. Another resource is newjerseytitle1arts.org is a heavily research based site that details how Title 1 funds can be allocated to arts programming. Mr. Moroney would like to see the Board and Administration develop an ambitious, districtwide vision for the arts at Keyport schools at all levels. One that builds from year to year, just like other subjects, and allows for new professional development opportunities for teachers and looks for ways to involve the community and parents and incorporates any available grants and other assistance. I think we can make Keyport Schools a model of a district that truly values the arts.
- Dennis Fotopoulos, 77A Beers Street, supports the statements of Mr. Moroney. Our little borough is emerging as an arts hub in the county and state. With the support of a vibrant arts program in school, the children of the community may want to follow in the artistic and professional footsteps of their relatives and neighbors and should be given the formal opportunity within our schools to do so.
- Jolyn Vallarta, 26 Perry Street, stated she loved seeing the children's artwork at the first Art Show this year and would like to see more art fill the school. She encouraged the district to send Mr. Morelos to attend the National Art

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Education Association Convention held in Boston in March 2019 for professional development. This would give him the tools he needs to grow our art department in innovative ways by seeing what is done around the country. Ms. Vallarta would like to see the field trip to the Middletown Arts Center be opened to artistically gifted students selected by Mr. Morelos, not just students in G&T Program.

- Laura Abrahamsen, 12 Maple Place, stated that music education is essential, not just music theory or history but picking up an instrument can increase SAT scores, improve language and memorization skills and even coordination. I love Keyport and want to stay here and have my children go to school here but don't want to limit their options.
- Joanne Kelsey, 29 St. Peters Place, stated music plays a huge part in her life. She never realized growing up how much the arts were supported in her school until she came to Keyport. The more she hears about our neighboring towns' music programs, the more she wants to move out of Keyport. If we want to grow Keyport into a more cultured and vibrant community, she urges the district to focus more on the arts.
- April Monroe, 84 Division Street, stated that Art Education is a vital way to connect with the community. Research shows the benefits of a strong art program show students are 4 times more likely to be recognized for academic achievement and 3 times more likely to be awarded for school attendance. SAT scores are 38-58 points higher for students in a 4-year art program than similar students who spent less than a year in an art program. Music has shown not only to improve math and reading, it promotes creativity, self-worth, social development and personal adjustment. She loves the town and vibrant quirky artistic community. She encourages supporting future spending on artistic programs and finding alternative sources of funding for these initiatives.
- Catherine Galli, 30 Monroe Street, is a mosaic artist. She spoke of the importance of art in all of our lives. Art is a huge outlet to break away from typical academics and keeps you grounded. Not every child is an athlete but they can express themselves through art. Art keeps kids away from drugs. She is here to support the arts program. Keyport is a great town and it should shine.

 - Music theory incorporated with practical knowledge and performance-based teaching in music class
 - Music class once a week for grades pre-k thru eighth grades (or an entire marking period where applicable)
- Lifeline/Key Club at KHS is planning a day of memorial to honor the lives of the victims lost in the tragedies of school attacks. This request for the temporary memorial was brought to me not out of politics or debate and is scheduled for a day during the next week at the entrance of KHS.

7.0 Board Secretary's Report – Mr. Rapolla

Dr. Savoia gave the following report on behalf of Mr. Rapolla:

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- A 100-gallon hot water heater was leaking at Keyport High School and needed to be replaced. Motion 9.23 on the agenda.
- There is a boiler leaking at Keyport High School but it is not a problem at the moment because we don't run heat this time of year. Every summer, we are required to get the boilers inspected. At that time, we get an idea of what needs to be replaced. We are being told it will most likely cost between \$26,000 and \$45,000, depending on how many sections need to be replaced.
- We held a Security Vestibule Pre-bid meeting on May 16 and had the bid opening on May 31. Unfortunately, the two bids we received are exorbitant. Motion 9.19 is a motion to reject the bids.
- Lunch prices will remain the same for 2018-2019.
- We are purchasing a new sounds system for the field which will be portable and allow us to use in the gym as well.
- We are purchasing much needed carpet in the board office as well as new tiling for the Pre-k rooms.
- The purchase of a new scoreboard is being covered by our property insurance.
