Immunizations

Required immunizations for students in Pre-K and Kindergarten.

Pre-K

- DTaP - 4 doses with one dose given on or after 4th birthday or any 5 doses
- POLIO - 3 doses
- MMR - 1 dose
- HIB - 1 dose
- PNEUMOCOCCAL - 1 dose
- HBV - 3 doses
- Influenza is required between September 1, 2020 and December 31, 2020 if your child does not turn 5 before December 31.

Kindergarten

- DTaP - 4 doses with one dose given on or after 4th birthday or any 5 doses
- POLIO - 3 doses with 1 dose on or after 4th birthday or any 4 doses
- MEASLES - 2 doses
- RUBELLA AND MUMPS - 1 dose
- HBV - 3 doses
- Influenza is required between September 1, 2020 and December 31, 2020 if your child does not turn 5 before December 31.

Immunizations

Required immunizations for students in 6th Grade.

6th Grade

- Tdap (Tetanus, diphtheria, acellular pertussis) -booster required (A child does not need a Tdap dose until five years after the last DTP/DTaP or TD dose.)
- Meningococcal Vaccine - one dose required

Chromebook distribution for students in grades 9-12, will be on September 2nd between 9:00am-3:00pm at Central School. Distribution for students in PreK-8, will occur on September 3rd between 9:00am - 3:00pm. Please make sure to fill out the technology release form/Acceptable use policy on the [parent portal](#) before arriving.

Students in grades 6-12 are one-to-one in regards to devices. The district is piloting the ability for all students in these grades to bring their **charged** devices to school daily if they are on the hybrid model. There will be limited devices available for a student who does not charge or forgets their Chromebook at home. Virtual students will retain their chromebooks until they return to school in person.

The district has purchased additional Chromebooks that are scheduled to arrive in the district late October. The additional Chromebooks were purchased so that the district could essentially become one-to-one for all students. If your child is in grades PreK-5 and your circumstances change and you have not requested a chromebook prior to school starting, please contact the technology department by completing [this form](#). Any concerns regarding internet access issues with the chromebook distributed to your child will be addressed as soon as possible and should be communicated with [this form](#).

On September 2nd and 3rd, please enter the central school parking lot on Division/Union street, follow the barricades, and state your student's name and grade to our staff members. They will find and bring your student's Chromebook and charger.

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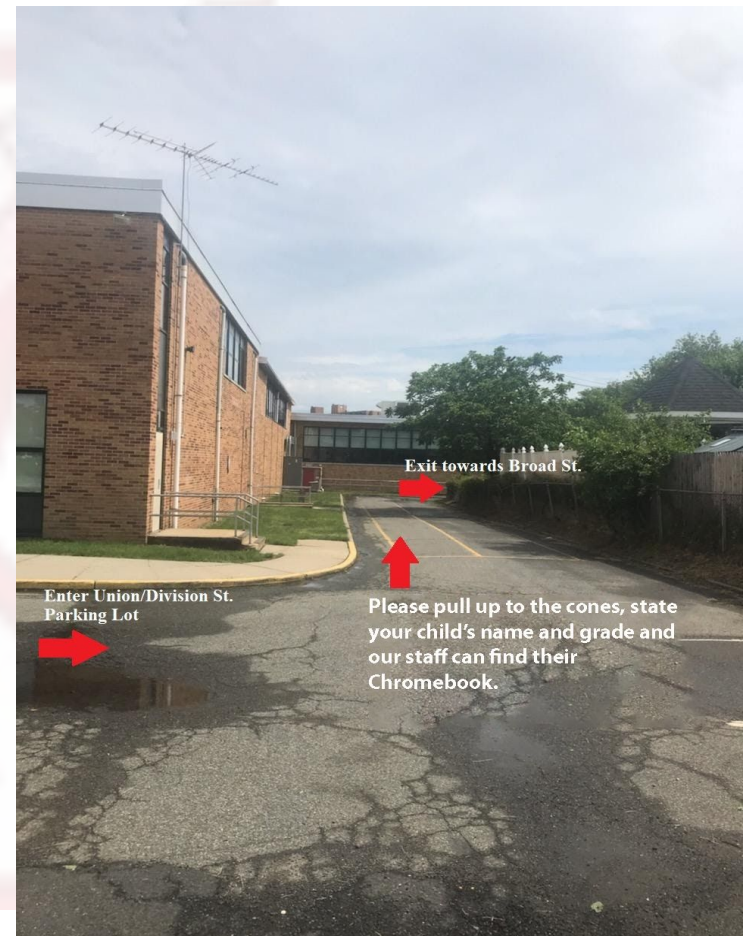

2020-2021 CENTRAL SCHOOL PEANUT/NUT ALLERGY GUIDELINES:

Strict avoidance of all peanut/nut products is the only way to prevent a life threatening allergic reaction. **Even touching a small amount of a product or accidental ingestion containing nuts could result in a life-threatening situation.** In order to reduce the risk of exposure at the Keyport Central School, peanuts/nuts or products containing peanuts/nuts are not allowed in any of the classrooms or common areas of the school except for the cafeteria.

Your cooperation in maintaining the following guidelines will ensure that the elementary school provides a safe and healthy environment for all of the children:

- **Please do not** send any products containing peanuts/nuts for your child to eat during snack/lunch in the classroom or on **class trips**. Read ingredient labels carefully.
- Children **may** bring peanut/nut products to be consumed in the **cafeteria only but cannot sit at the nut-free designated area**.
- **Make sure** that your child's hands have been thoroughly washed before entering school if they have eaten peanuts or any nuts prior to the start of the day.
- Encourage your child to get into the **habit of hand washing** before and after meals.
- **Food is not permitted for birthday celebrations**. Please refer to the Food Allergy Guidelines as they apply to birthday and other school celebrations.
- **Remind your child** not to share any food, eating utensils or food containers with other students.

At our school, we believe all families understand a parent's concern and worry about safety and will join us in ensuring that our environment is conducive to this goal.

Protocols & Procedures

Please refer to the [Student Daily COVID-19 Symptom Check Letter](#). This check-in system must be completed by all students/parents/guardians prior to departing for in-person school.

Student temperatures will be taken by a non-contact infrared thermometer prior to entering the building. Students must wear a mask while on campus and in the building.

Lockers will not be utilized until further notice.

Restrooms will be monitored for capacity as only two students will be permitted into each restroom at a time.

Visitors will not be permitted into the school building.

Attendance Procedure

As always, if a student is unable to attend school on a given day due to illness or appointment, parents are required to report the student's absence (732-212-6130 ext. 2000) or email csattendance@kpsdschools.org. If a student is scheduled to attend in-person on their scheduled day and is unable to attend school due to a mild illness, but is able to participate virtually, that student may participate in their classes through video conference. In this scenario, that student will be considered present as long as a parent contacts the attendance office in advance.
